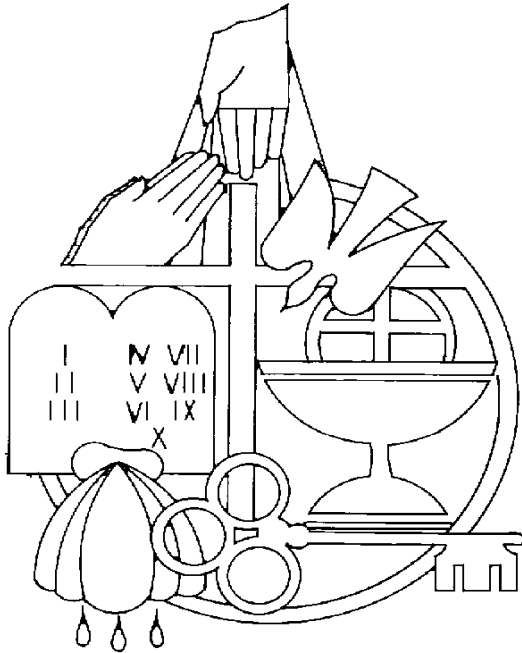

This Week in the Church Year

Just as the eyes of all wait upon the Lord, and He gives them their meat in due season; and as He opens up His hand to satisfy the desire of every living thing, so does He also provide for the nurture and sustenance of faith unto the life everlasting. In the Feeding of the Five Thousand, Jesus catechizes His disciples to believe and trust His Providence for both body and soul. The Evangelists record the miracle with language echoing the Last Supper, thereby signifying that Christ distributes His true body and blood, under the bread and wine, by the hand of His servants, for us Christians to eat and to drink.

Emphasis: Christ, the Living Bread, Feeds His Dear Children

The Order of Daily Catechesis in Word and Prayer

Pray and confess out loud as much from the order of daily catechesis as you and your family are able. Learn by heart the verse, catechism, and hymn of the week.

[The Opening Versicles and Psalmody]:

The Catechism: Christian Questions & Answers (continued)

After Individual Confession and instruction in the Ten Commandments, the Creed, the Lord's Prayer, and the Sacraments of Baptism and the Holy Supper, the Pastor may ask, or one may ask himself:

9. *What has Christ done for you that you trust in Him?*

He died for me and shed His blood for me on the Cross for the forgiveness of sins.

10. *Did the Father also die for you?*

He did not. The Father is God only, as is the Holy Spirit; but the Son is both true God and true Man. He died for me and shed His blood for me.

11. *How do you know this?*

From the Holy Gospel, from the Words instituting the Sacrament, and by His body and blood given me as a pledge in the Sacrament.

12. *What are the Words of Institution?*

Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night when He was betrayed, took bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to the disciples and said: ‘Take, eat; this is My Body, which is given for you. This do in remembrance of Me.’

In the same way also He took the cup after supper, and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, saying: ‘Drink of it, all of you; this cup is the New Testament in My Blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me.’

13. *Do you believe, then, that the true body and blood of Christ are in the Sacrament?*

Yes, I believe it.

14. *What convinces you to believe this?*

**The Word of Christ: ‘Take, eat, this is My Body.’
‘Drink of it, all of you, this is My Blood.’**

15. *What should we do when we eat His body and drink His blood, and in this way receive His pledge?*

We should remember and proclaim His death and the shedding of His blood, as He taught us: ‘This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me.’

Note: *These questions and answers are no child’s play, but are drawn up with great earnestness of purpose by the venerable and pious Dr. Luther for both young and old. Let each one take heed and likewise consider it a serious matter; for Saint Paul writes to the Galatians in chapter six: ‘Do not be deceived: God cannot be mocked.’*

Daily Themes for Intercessory Prayer:

Sunday: *For the joy of the Resurrection; for the faithful preaching and hearing of God's Word; for the fruit of faith nourished by the Word and Sacraments.*

Monday: *For faith to live in the promises of Holy Baptism; for vocations and daily work; for the unemployed; for the salvation and well-being of our neighbors; for Resurrection Lutheran Academy and other schools, our home schools, our colleges and seminaries; for good government and peace.*

- Tuesday:** For deliverance against temptation and evil; for the addicted and despairing; for the tortured and oppressed; for those struggling with sin.

Commemoration of St. Laurence, Deacon and Martyr**Thursday, 10 August**

Early in the third century, Laurence, most likely born in Spain, made his way to Rome. There he was appointed chief of the seven deacons and was given the responsibility to manage church property and finances. The emperor at the time, who thought that the church had valuable things worth confiscating, ordered Laurence to produce the “treasures of the church.” Laurence brought before the emperor the poor whose lives had been touched by Christian charity. He was then jailed and eventually executed in the year 258 by being roasted on a gridiron. His martyrdom left a deep impression on the young church. Almost immediately, the date of His death, 10 August, became a permanent fixture on the early commemorative calendar of the Church.

Let each his lesson learn with care, and all the household well shall fare.
